Together, they built a 50-year legacy with Millstone, leaving behind not only a thriving business but also countless friendships nurtured through it.

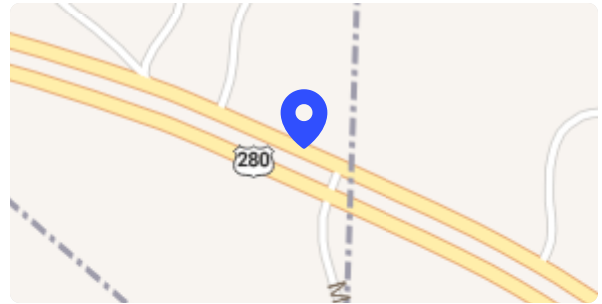

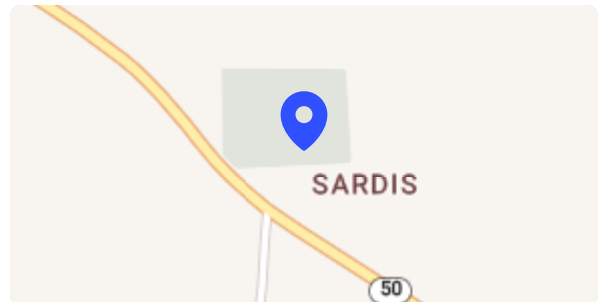

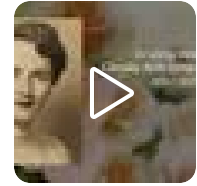
